### **Thanksgiving**

This is the weekend where we pause and remember to give thanks to God for the many blessings in our lives. Traditionally, of course, this was harvest thanksgiving - thanks for the crops - the grain, the vegetables, the fruit. But we are not as agrarian as we once were. Many of us can give thanks for the produce of the garden, both vegetables and flowers, however our Thanksgiving needs do not stop there. Let us give thanks for the homes in which we live. For the meals we enjoy. For the technology that helps keep us connected. Let us give thanks for our community of faith, for family, and for who are precious to us. As we pause this weekend to give thanks, may we not forget to give thanks each day, for we are blessed each day.





### **Hybrid Worship**

When we last worshiped outdoors, some joined in the service by connecting on Zoom at the same time. This is hybrid worship - with both in-person and on-line components. Thanksgiving Sunday will also be hybrid, but, we hope, with a better set-up so that the on-line component will be improved. We expect that the reader will be on-line. We anticipate that we will maintain our on-line presence in the future even when not needed because of COVID - so that those who cannot physically make it to the building on a given week can still worship - connecting on-line. We will work to improve both the in-person and on-line experience so that all can participate.

### **Vaccination Mandate**

Our Church Council has made the decision that the in-person component of our worship will be open to those who are fully vaccinated (or ineligible for vaccination - example, those 11 and under at this time). Some may interpret our vaccination policy as being unwelcoming - but far from it. Everyone is welcome to worship with us, however, those who are eligible for vaccination but who are not fully vaccinated are welcome to worship through our Zoom connection. By taking this stance, those who are vaccinated but still relatively vulnerable will be able to gather in-person if they choose. As a Christian community, we should always consider the more vulnerable in the community - these become our priority. At the same time we will work hard to make the on-line component of our worship as good as possible. This approach is shared with some of the other United Churches that are a part of our Regional Council.

Good news. As mentioned earlier, the Canadian Government has agreed to provide the community with a grant to support modifications to the Côte St. Charles United Church in order to make the building accessible to people with different abilities.

On Monday, October 4, we received a cheque for \$100,000 for exactly that purpose. As a part of the agreement, we have to complete the work within two years, or we will need to return the money.

This is excellent news, and is really helping towards our continued fundraising efforts.
